

PE and Sport Premium

PE- Premium Action Plan 2015/2016

Funding Allocation-£8,870 + £5035 carried over from previous year

In 2013 the Government introduced a PE and Sport Premium grant for primary schools. It is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

Over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016 schools will receive over £450 million for this funding.

For 2015/16 Foxdell Infants received £8,870. The details of how this was spent and the impact it had on PE an sport across the school are shown below.
